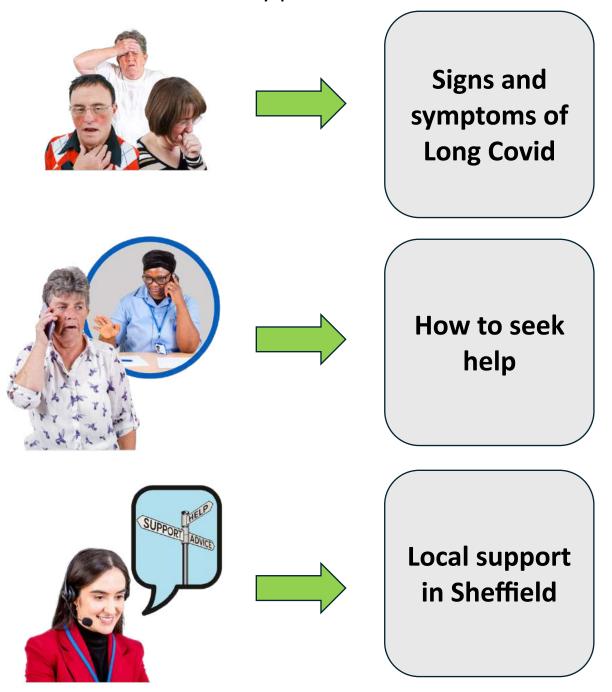




Presentation about Long Covid

What do you want our Disability **Network to be doing?**

Inclusivity

To be inclusive to people who use day services. To promote and encourage methods of inclusivity across Sheffield and the services.

Collaborative

Professionals promoting each other and sharing information learnt. People in need get the most complete and holistic support possible.

Democratic

To have more opportunity to feedback what the most important topics are to people. Not just Sheffield Voices asking for feedback on their chosen topics.

Regular

Monthly meetings to be held in person or online.

More representatives are

Efficiency

Minimise the same information being given, to avoid time wasting and confusion.



Networking

More opportunities for networking (including evenings and weekends)

Guidance & Advice

Communication – The best form of contact discussed beforehand (email, text, or phone?)

Better promotion

Increased promotions of all the services that are available to the people in Sheffield.

Awareness

Better public awareness to reduce discrimination across all disabilities.

Employment

More employment opportunities

Accessibility

More BSL or Makaton access in the public.

Bus driver awareness

Drivers being more mindful of people moving on/off bus and being patient with people with disabilities.

Road safety

To increase the number of safe places to cross the road across Sheffield.



Representation

Disability forums and organisations should be chaired by and directed by disabled people.

Youth Services

More service provisions for 16–18-year-olds, not just colleges or the option of going straight into day services.

Transport

Disability bells upstairs as well as downstairs on buses/public transport

Sport

Pond Forge Leisure
Pool to be open in the
daytime (with the wave
machine
and rapids on).

Transport

Travel training to be mandatory to increase awareness for those on/working on public transport.

What changes do you want to see happening? (page 2)

PAs / support staff

Higher quality PAs / support staff. It's often seen 1-1 PAs ignoring the person they are supposed to be supporting.

In addition to high level of checks and reporting.

Networking

More people and organisations actively taking part in events across the city and surrounding areas.

Travel

Travel training to increase the awareness of disabled passengers on public transport.

Independent living

More and earlier support in place for those independently living.



Communication

More ongoing engagement between disabled people and representatives of health services, council, and other organisations

Disabled Parking in Hospitals

Hospitals in the area have minimal disabled parking bays. In particular Hallamshire Hospital and Northern General. Some only having 6 spaces, not enough space for a wheelchair, this can be dangerous for those attempting to park and access the hospital

Representation

Working together on specific issues to which individual disabled people can contribute their views

What do you think is missing in the Sheffield Disability community?

Basic access!

Things should be made accessible without it being a "hassle"

Collaboration

A fluid connection between services – e.g. the referral system

Deaf community

Advocacy for Deaf people

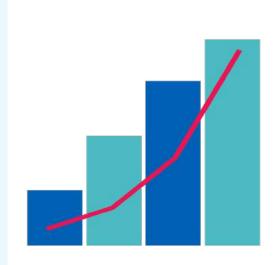

We will be collecting all the information gathered at this event, seeing how we can make any changes needed, thenplan another event in 3 months' time. We will meet with the group and discuss progress and plans for changes based on their comments. We will think about how we can continue to support the members of the group and the wider community in Sheffield to make a difference.

We will be focusing on setting up groups local those to more communities in need, that perhaps cannot travel to the centre of Sheffield. Such Deaf as а community group meeting in Meadowhall and groups in ASDA. We will think about where we can access suitable places and meeting areas for free to minimise costs.





We will aim to set up a group with relevant professionals and invite members of the disabled community in Sheffield. We will feedback directly to them and to set up a wider network to see how we can all work together to aim to implement the changes needed.
