EIGE's gender statistics database to be launched in October: a data gateway offering statistical information on gender equality

EIGE is launching a new database that provides a single access point for all gender statistics at the EU and Member State levels. The database is a central source of reliable and internationally comparable sex-disaggregated data on various aspects of (in)equalities between women and men. It includes statistics on situations at work and in the labour market, financial and economic situation, use of time, education and training, and gender-based violence, among many others. Make Your Mark 2015 results - Sheffield Futures / Youth Parliament

Make Your Mark is an opportunity for young people to have their say on what the UK Youth Parliament should debate in the House of Commons and campaign on. This year in Sheffield the same issue has come top overall, plus the 5 issues voted on nationally are the same 5 that young people across Sheffield voted for. Nationally the total vote was 967,000 – Sheffield made up 12,922 of those. The top 10 issues in Sheffield are:

- 1. Votes at 16
- 2. A Curriculum to prepare us for life
- 3. The end of austerity and child poverty
- 4. Transport
- 5. Climate Change
- 6. Mental health
- 7. Fund our youth services, don't cut them
- 8. Living Wage
- 9. Tackling racism and religious discrimination, particularly against people who are Muslim or lewish
- 10. Extended Special Educational Needs support
