

# Explore Accessible Places in Sheffield with Sociability!

Sociability, a disabled-led company, is hosting a Mapping Day in Sheffield City Centre as part of its ongoing mission to make accessibility information visible, shared and celebrated.

The Mapping Day is a relaxed, community-focused event taking place on **Friday 30th May from 12pm to 4pm**, beginning at **Sheffield Train Station**. It's free to attend, and open to anyone – whether you're disabled, neurodivergent, a carer, friend or ally.

Together with the Sociability team, participants will explore local venues – from cafés to pubs and restaurants – to document their accessibility using the free Sociability mobile app. No experience or tech skills are needed, and you'll be guided throughout.

From **12.15pm to 3pm**, you'll head out in small groups to map local spots, before coming together from **3pm to 4pm** for coffee and cake (on Sociability!) to connect and reflect on the day.

Sociability is all about empowering disabled people to explore the world with confidence. Its app features detailed accessibility info for thousands of venues across the UK, and Mapping Days help build this resource with real, lived experience.
